Supervisor Gardner offered the floor to Ken Hughes, Essex Initiatives. Ken described the objects of this group and that they are trying to become non-profit. He asked that the board support this group by having a board member become a voting member of the Essex Initiatives board. Members of the town board asked questions and shared concerns. They thanked Ken for this input.

Supervisor Gardner asked if anyone else would like to address the board. Derrick Wrisley told the board that he got his certification in the mail today, and was wondering what was going to happen and questions why he is being dismissed. He asked if he had done something wrong. At this point Bryan Garvey suggested we discuss this in a closed meeting.

A motion to enter into Executive session at 615pm to discuss the personnel issue of a certain person was made. All in favor no nays.

Supervisor Gardner at 6:30 made a motion to re-enter the regular meeting. No decisions were made.

Supervisor Gardner asked if anyone else wished to speak. Tom Stransky was wondering if as in the town board is planning for the future and developing committees to do this. Supervisor Gardner explained that the board is being proactive by; establishing a committee at the first meeting to look at various procedures and plans, planning for highway purchases, looking at the water. Mr. Stransky also asked where the broad band issue was. Supervisor Gardner explained that this area was excluded from round one of the state funding but the Willsboro Essex Development Committee is still actively pursuing this. He asked Ken Hughes, who is also on that committee for his input.

Supervisor Gardner reported that there were no responses to the ad and that he was informed today from the Supervisor of Willsboro that at their town board meeting last night they decided not to go into a contract for shared services with us for the Zoning/Codes officer. He does not know why but feels that there is more to this than this contract because they were trying to tie it into this their newly purchased Senior Van. After some discussion, Supervisor Gardner will ask if there are any other communities that may be willing to do a shared service and try calling a couple of people Lauren Murphy suggested. The town clerk asked if the state should be notified of this. Supervisor Gardner will look into it.

Supervisor has opened up the discussion to sell the Old Stone Church. Bryan Garvey supports putting it out to sealed bid, selling it to the highest bidder. Gretel asks that a large portion of this money be used to support a clear benefit and not to just pay off bills. Discussion ensued about the appraisal and what some perceive as a true value. The minimum bid has to be the appraisal. At the next meeting a motion will be introduced with final details including use of the money.

A motion was made by James LaForest, seconded by Bryan Garvey to sell the Old Stone Church by sealed bid, with the details of the sale with the Attorney for the town.

The following resolution was requested from Bradley French to support increase in CHIPS money.

## Resolution 36-2016

Whereas, a reliable transportation infrastructure is vital for the safety of New York's travelling public and its economy; and

Whereas, 85 percent of New York's roads and bridges are maintained by local governments; and

Whereas, despite well-timed and targeted preventative maintenance treatments, the age and condition of many of our locally-owned transportation assets means that they are beyond preservation and in need of much more costly rehabilitation and reconstruction; and

Whereas, estimates by the State Comptroller, DOT and independent studies show a large portion of road mileage is deteriorating and many bridges in the state are rated structurally deficient and functionally obsolete; and

Whereas, the State Comptroller estimates that there will be \$89 billion in unmet local infrastructure needs over the next 20 years; and

Whereas, the New York State Association of Town Superintendents of Highways commissioned its own fifteen year analysis that indicates an annual funding gap of \$1.3 billion for the local system (excluding NYC) alone; and

**Whereas**, funding for our local system has been far short of what is needed and we've fallen further and further behind in maintaining the vast and aging transportation infrastructure over this long period with severe consequences for conditions ratings; and

Whereas, the New York State Consolidated Local Street and Highway Program (CHIPS) provides essential funding for every municipality in the state and is part of the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) capital program; and

**Whereas**, in the early 1990's the Governor and Legislature created the Dedicated Highway and Bridge Trust Fund (DHBTF) to pay for the NYSDOT capital program and the Dedicated Mass Transit Trust Fund (DMTTF) to assist with the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) and other transit systems' capital programs; and Whereas, when the DHBTF was created, it was agreed that the NYSDOT and MTA five-year capital programs would be similar in size and would be negotiated concurrently; and

**Whereas,** through 2005-09, both five-year capital programs were similar in size and adopted within months of each other; and in 2010 the Executive and Legislature broke traditional parity and enacted a five-year capital program for the MTA but not the DOT;

**NOW THEREFORE BE ITRESOLVED**, that the Town of Essex calls upon the Governor and the state Legislature to make additional state funding and resources available at levels that accurately reflect the critical needs of local roads and bridges; and increase CHIPS funding in the 2016-17 state budget; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Essex calls upon the Governor, and members of the state Legislature to fully fund and submit a new NYSDOT five-year transportation capital plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Essex calls upon the Governor and members of the state Legislature to recognize the equality of roads, bridges and transit by restoring funding equality between the MTA and NYSDOT five-year programs and by voting on the plans simultaneously.
